Craig Leslie Mantle received his PhD in military and strategic studies from the University of Calgary in 2013. He has taught courses for both the Royal Military College of Canada and the Canadian Forces College.

After working for a decade at the Canadian Forces Leadership Institute where he had the opportunity to publish widely on a number of leadership-related topics from both an historical and contemporary perspective, he spent a further year and a half working as the post-1945 historian at the Canadian War Museum. He is affiliated with two professional organizations: the Conference of Defence Associations Institute as a research fellow and the Laurier Centre for Military Strategic and Disarmament Studies at Wilfrid Laurier University as an adjunct faculty associate.

His research interests, broadly speaking, include oral history, leadership, material culture and the experience of military service from South Africa to Afghanistan. A strong believer in community service and involvement, Dr. Mantle is actively involved with St. John Ambulance in Kingston; he currently sits on the board of Loyalist Branch, as well as on a number of separate committees.
