Ms. Maddox previously contributed Arctic expertise through work with the European Centre of Excellence for Countering Hybrid Threats and the Newport Arctic Scholars Initiative of the U.S. Naval War College. She has taught an Environmental Security graduate course at Syracuse University as an adjunct professor.
