Ayesha Siddiqi is an Associate Professor at the Department of Geography at University of Cambridge. Her research focus is on postcolonial understandings of hazard related risk especially in contexts of conflict,

insurgency and underlying insecurity. Ayesha's research uses qualitative, arts based, research methods to explore complex issues around disaster risk and climate security in the Global South. She has worked with communities living with flooding and Islamist violence in Pakistan, typhoons and armed insurgency in the Philippines and landslides and militancy in Colombia. Her book *In the Wake of Disaster: Islamists, the State and a Social Contract in Pakistan* was published by



Cambridge University Press in 2019. She has an interdisciplinary background and has done considerable work on the interface of academia and policy, including a secondment at the UK's Houses of Parliament and exhibitions with local artists in South Africa and Peru.
