The CDA Institute is Canada's veteran-led defence & security think tank dedicated to fostering a facts-based, rational and experience-driven approach to defence and security policy.

Our purpose is to influence security and defence policy in Canada, educate the public through peer-reviewed research and analysis, and recognize leadership in the defence and security community.

The **Conference of Defence Associations** (CDA) was founded in 1932 and today serves as an umbrella group for 45 member associations that represent over 400,000 active and retired members of the Canadian Armed Forces. The CDA is a connector in the defence and security community that provides influence and visibility for member associations towards national engagement, as well as a hub where Canadians interested in matters of security and defence can converge for events, research, and analysis, as well as mentorship employment opportunities.

In 1987, the CDA founded the **Conference of Defence Associations Institute** (CDA Institute), a non-partisan registered charity organization with the mission to advance informed debate on national security issues, particularly those that pertain to national defence and the Canadian Armed Forces. The CDA Institute serves as a forum for informed public debate on national security and defence policies, fostering an understanding of the importance of these policies to Canada's security and prosperity.

The pages of this Annual Report are intended to demonstrate the impact of your engagement and show you how hard we're working to ensure our collective voice is heard in the places where it matters most.

The event is more than a ceremony it is a recognition gala that provides the members of the defence and security community the opportunity to celebrate the achievements of outstanding Canadians.

Vimy Award



Established in 1991 and presented annually at the Vimy Gala, the Vimy Award recognizes a Canadian who has made significant, outstanding and enduring contribution to the defence and security of our nation and the preservation of our democratic values.

The award honours the bravery and sacrifice of the Canadian soldiers – comprising the four divisions of the Canadian Corps – who were victorious in the battle of Vimy Ridge in April 1917.

A key highlight of the Vimy Gala is the presentation of the prestigious Vimy Award, which has been a tradition for over 30 years.

The first award was presented in 1991 to the Right Honourable Joe Clark, former Prime Minister of Canada, in recognition of his efforts to strengthen Canada's defence and security.

2024 Vimy Award Laureate

The Conference of Defence Associations Institute was proud to honour the 2024 Laureate of the Vimy Award, General (Ret'd) Walter Natynczyk.

Known to many as "Uncle Walt," General Natynczyk's career and service to the nation have been exemplary, culminating with the roles of Chief of the Defence Staff, President of the Canadian Space Agency, and Deputy Minister of Veterans Affairs.

MONTRÉAL CLIMATE SECURITY SUMMIT

The **Montreal Climate Security Summit** is an annual international meeting at the intersection of climate change and security that brings together participants from across the NATO Alliance and beyond.

In 2024...

For its third edition, the Montreal Summit was conducted and hosted in partnership with the newly launched NATO Climate Change and Security Centre of Excellence (CCASCOE), on October 29th-30th, at Palais des Congrès de Montréal.

We welcomed an audience of **300+ guests** composed of highlevel civilian and military practitioners, policy makers, decision makers, and seasoned researchers hailing from NATO member countries, multilateral and regional organizations, industry, think tanks, and civil society.



In 2022 and 2023, the NATO CCASCOE, the European Union, U.S. Department of State, the International Committee of the Red Cross, NATO, and the Canadian Department of National Defence provided funding to support the event.

AWARDS & RECOGNITIONS



The Ross Munro Award

The Ross Munro Award recognizes Canadians whose outstanding service to their craft is a testament to the power of national defence and security storytelling in journalism, videography, photojournalism, or authorship.

Award recipients demonstrate professional excellence and objectiv-

ity in coverage of national defence and security issues, providing insight, analysis, or examination of the context. Their works of distinction demonstrate the importance of sharing stories that impact all Canadians and strengthen and preserve democratic values.

2024 Laureates

In 2024, the CDA Institute was proud to name Steven Chase Senior (Parliamentary Reporter, *The Globe and Mail*) and Robert Fife (Ottawa Bureau Chief, *The Globe and Mail*) as the laureates of the Ross Munro Award.



Their award marked the first time that the Ross Munro Award had

been given to two laureates in the same year, and was awarded on the basis of journalism excellence. In particular, the award recognized their recent reporting of allegations of Chinese interference in Canadian elections and the claim that India was involved in the assassination of a Sikh activist in British Columbia.



The Captain Nichola Goddard Leadership Award

The Captain Nichola Goddard Leadership Award was created to recognize and honour a young Canadian innovator and trailblazer who has made an inspiring early or mid-career contribution to Canadian security and defence.

The Captain Nichola Goddard award is about remembering the leadership qualities of Nichola Goddard, her character and her vibrant spirit. The award is intended to celebrate Canadians who live and succeed by the same values that Nichola demonstrated such as inclusivity, commitment, courage, and valour within our defence and security community including Canadian Armed Forces, academia and industry.

2024 Laureate

In 2024, the CDA Institute was proud to name Master Sailor (ret'd) Antoine Lavoie as the Captain Nichola Goddard Award laureate.

Mr. Lavoie received the award on the basis of his visionary leadership and advocacy for members of the LGBTQ2+ community, which garnered significant traction amongst his peers and senior military leadership.



FORCE DEVELOPMENT SERIES

Bringing together government, industry, academia, and military stakeholders to find solutions to Canada's and the Canadian Armed Forces' most pressing challenge.

Launched in 2020, the Force Development Series hosts subject matter-specific roundtables held under Chatham House Rule, experts from Canada and likeminded countries share insights on the most pressing challenges impacting the CAF's capabilities and readiness and the implications for Canada.

Events & Published Reports (2024)

The discussion outcomes of each Force Development roundtable are synthesized into reports, furthering national discussion on defence policy and shedding light on the critical importance of a ready and equipped CAF in today's increasingly contested world.



Digital Transformation in the Canadian Armed Forces December 2024



An analysis of the ongoing implementation of digital transformation in the CAF. Presentations discussed the critical role of cloud-based and emerging technologies, institutional and operational perspectives on obstacles and strategic prioritization of requirements, and the central challenge of communicating what digital transformation is and means for Canadians.



The Future of Land Warfare and the Canadian Army October 2024



An assessment of the state of the Canadian Army and its capacity to meet the demands of modern warfare with significant resource and personnel constraints. Hosted in August 2024, panels discussed the current operating environment and the challenges faced by main and supporting combat arms exacerbated by recruitment and retention shortfalls, aging equipment and conflicting domestic demands that impact training schedules.



Defence and Industrial Base Cooperation Amongst Allies Winter 2025

This event marked the CDA Institute's first partnership with the Embassy of Canada to the United States in Washington, D.C.

In October 2024, we hosted senior public servants from the USA, UK, Australia, New Zealand, and Canada to discuss the complex dynamics that impact defence procurement, industrial base optimization and integration, and strategic alignment within and between Five Eyes' governments.

The CDA Institute's peer-reviewed publications aim to educate and engage the public, academia, policymakers, and other stakeholders in meaningful discussions about national and international security issues.



YOUNG PROFESSIONALS PROGRAMME

Fostering the next generation of security and defence leaders.

The **Young Professionals Programme** supports students and recent graduates by providing internships, mentorship opportunities, complimentary access to flagship events, and networking platforms designed to develop skills, confidence, and knowledge of the field.

Since its inception, **the program has engaged over 2,000 motivated individuals** eager to learn and grow, fostering a vibrant community of young professionals.

In 2024, the CDA Institute invested over \$100,000 in our Young Professionals Programme in the form of scholarships, fellowships, internships, travel stipends, publishing young scholars, and providing access to our flagship events.

The impact of the CDA Institute's efforts is evident in the success of its young staff and research interns, who have advanced to graduate and doctoral programs, as well as careers in politics, government, international organizations, the private sector, and think tanks worldwide.



Through its programs, the CDA Institute strives to nurture the future of Canada's defence and security community.

GRADUATE STUDENT CONFERENCE

The CDA Institute's Graduate Student Conference is an annual event that provides graduate stu-

dents, recent graduates, and young professionals with an opportunity to present their research, receive feedback from senior leaders in government, industry, and academia, and build meaningful professional connections.

The conference awards over \$10,000 annually in prize money for top presentations. Travel stipends are available, and the event includes an evening social for networking.

This conference offers a platform to refine research, connect with influential decision-makers, and advance careers in national security.



STUDENT AMBASSADOR PROGRAMME

The **Student Ambassador Programme** offers undergraduate students across Canada a unique opportunity to engage with national security and defence issues while gaining hands-on experience in event planning and professional networking.



The program empowers ambassadors to organize on-campus events such as panel discussions, roundtables, and symposiums, fostering discussions on topics like Arctic sovereignty, NATO, climate change, and emerging technologies.

Ambassadors receive funding support for events, recognition on



the CDA Institute's platforms, access to exclusive opportunities like the Graduate Student Conference and Mentorship Programme, and a recommendation letter upon successful completion.

MENTORSHIP PROGRAMME

The CDA Institute Mentorship Programme connects young professionals (aged 30 and under) with established leaders in the defence and security sector.

This program offers a unique chance to expand professional networks, gain industry insights, and grow under the guidance of experienced leaders.



VALUABLE GROWTH

Through strategic matching, mentees gain valuable career guidance, skills development, and networking opportunities with at least two hours of mentorship per month.



EXPERT INSIGHTS

Mentors include senior government officials, ambassadors, business executives, academics, journalists, and members of the Canadian Armed Forces.



PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

Over a four-month program, mentees engage in activities such as one-on-one meetings, career planning, job shadowing, and networking.

The CDA Institute has become a trusted, indispensable voice for Members of Parliament, journalists, policy professionals, academics, and the general public.

PARLIAMENTARY COMMITTEE APPEARANCES

Standing Senate Committee on National Security, Defence, and Veterans Affairs



On June 3rd, 2024, **CDA Executive Director Youri Cormier** brought attention to the need for Canada to improve procurement processes and leverage alliances like NORAD, NATO, and the Five Eyes, calling for greater integration with the U.S. defence industrial base.

He highlighted the necessity of transparency, efficiency, and costeffective weapon procurement practices; enhancing parliamentary oversight; adjusting Canada's risk tolerance in defence procurement; and revis-

iting the Industrial and Technological Benefits policy to better serve the Canadian Armed Forces' needs and improve readiness.


