Martin Green is a Senior Advisor at Global Public Affairs, a Senior Fellow at the MacDonald-Laurier Institute and a Partner in the Vancouver International Security Summit. He leads Lancaster North, his consulting firm. A former senior public servant and political aide, he brings over 15 years of specialized experience in foreign, defence, national security, and intelligence policy and issues.



From 2015-2024, Green served as Assistant Secretary to Cabinet, Intelligence Assessment, the Privy Council Office, where he provided covert and open-source foreign intelligence analysis to the Prime Minister, Cabinet, and the senior leadership of the Government of Canada. In this capacity he played a key leadership role in the Canadian intelligence community and fostered relationships with allied intelligence organizations and other partners globally.

As Director General Policy Planning at the Department of National Defence (2011-2015), Green advised senior Government of Canada leadership on emerging global security trends including cyber and space policy, export permits, foreign investment arms control and non-proliferation.

Previously, Green held senior management positions at Environment Canada, in the Intergovernmental Affairs and Ops Secretariats of the Privy Council Office, Industry Canada, and at Human Resources and Skills Development Canada.

Prior to joining the Public Service, Green was a senior political aide to several Ministers of the Crown including: the Ministers of Industry, Trade, Environment, as well as to the President of Treasury Board. During this time Mr. Green also worked on the Olympic Winter Games in Calgary and in the Senate of Canada.

Mr. Green holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Glendon College, York University, Toronto. He resides in Ottawa, ON with his wife, Sheila, they have two daughters.
